Tone On Tone

Minimum 5 X 7 sewing area required

- Santi's Hatched In Africa Jacobean Jewell Peacock Design available from <http://www.hatchedinafrica.com/jacobeanpeacock.html> (YOU MUST PURCHASE THE DESIGNS AND HAVE IT BEFORE COMING TO CLASS and already have it loaded on your machine or on a disk/card/USB to put in your machine.) I have made alterations to the designs, so please tell the store what format of the design you use with your machine, and also make sure you have a way to get the altered designs to your machine at class. I will have it on a USB stick in the following formats: pes, hus, vip, vip3, jef, sew, exp, shv, dst, pcs, csd and xxx.
- Embroidery Thread (40wt) to stitch Peacock design. **You will only need 2 to 3 colors to do the tone on tone in the same color value. We will not be stitching the peacock in the 26 colors of the design to save time. Once you do the tone on tone peacock, you can stitch another one out at home using the skills you have learned in class.**
- Bobbins; at least 4 of the pre-wound NEBS or more if you wind them yourself
- **Stabilizers, either Jenny Haskins or comparable:**
 - ❖ Jenny Haskins Sheer Magic Plus fusible stabilizer for the back of your garment. (12"X16).
 - ❖ Jenny Haskins Hoop Magic sticky tear way for the hoop.
 - ❖ Jenny Haskins Dissolve Topping Magic
- Scissors, Embroidery Needles, Pins, bobbins, Marking pen and ruler
- Don't forget your power cord for your machine, embroidery module and your hoops.
- I will demonstrate how to apply your crystals during the class.
- Your garment you wish to stitch the Peacock on. I suggest a cotton or linen shirt, jeans jacket or other jacket. Please do not plan on using a stretchy fabric as you will not be happy with the results.

The design can be put together with the 5X7 hoop.

Take the time to do a little maintenance on your machine before you come to class. Make sure you have thoroughly cleaned out the bobbin area and it is free of lint and dust. This will save you valuable stitching time in class to not have any problems with your machine. If you cannot remember when you changed the needle last, put in a new needle and bring some extras just in case to have ready for class.

If you have not had your machine serviced within the last year, bring it in for a tune up before the class. This design will take the entire day to stitch out, and if you have machine problems you will not be able to finish the design in the class time. Your machine should be serviced at least every year, so make an appointment and get it done. You will be a much happier person in the class.
