## Class Supply List

1. **Free standing lace design:** Make sure that the design you are stitching is for free standing lace, and not just a lace design intended to be stitched out on fabric. It should state that the design is for free

standing lace, if it does not it is probably intended to be stitched out on fabric, organza or tulle. If you need some ideas I suggest you try the following websites, as many of them have free downloads and samples you can use, or ask Dolly for assistance in selecting some appropriate designs.

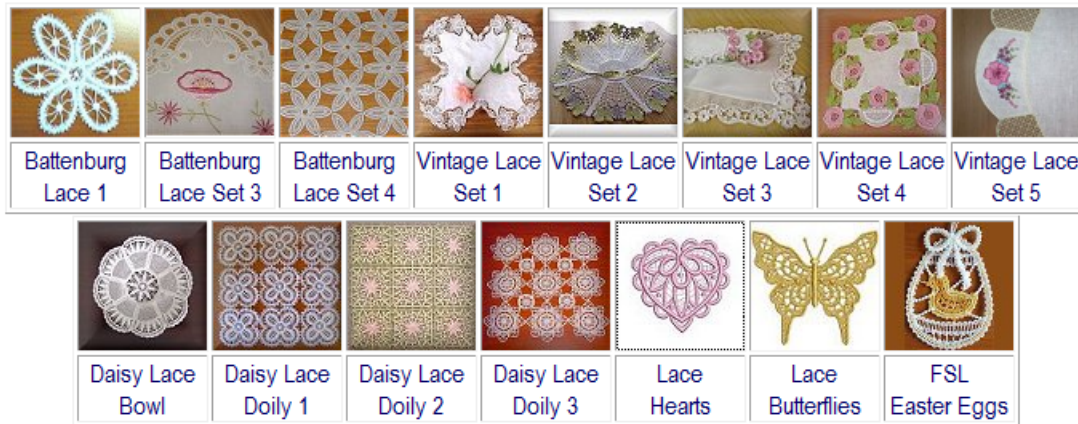

2. **Water soluble stabilizer (WSS)** that will wash away 100% from your lace such as Vilene (I recommend 2 to 3 layers to stitch out lace), Aqua Magic, Aqua Melt or another product intended for stitching out lace designs. **I do not recommend using Solvy Water Soluble Stabilizer for stitching lace. Use it as a topping when embroidering on material.**
3. #40 weight matching embroidery thread for the top and the bobbin in either polyester or rayon.
4. The T-Shirt you would like to place and sew the lace on to.
5. Sewing and embroidery machine, scissors, pins.
